## AROUND THE SOCIETY...

An update on our educational outreach:

In November two of our members gave a presentation to the third-graders at South Elementary on early businesses in Mt. Healthy. The students got to see photographs of the town from the late 1800s and early 1900s, and were excited to recognize buildings that house businesses familiar to them, such as Aquatics and Exotics. They also got to see some artifacts from our general store display and an authentic Mt. Healthy brick.

In February we went again and presented a program on transportation and communication. This time they got to see pictures of the old train and the traction car line that once connected Mt. Healthy with Cincinnati. The children always enjoy the historical artifacts we bring for them to see, such as the antique candlestick telephone we took when we talked about communication as it existed 100 years ago.

We're hoping that the classes will be able to visit the museum in May. We have worked with the teachers to make sure that our programs align with the goals and learning objectives required for the third-grade curriculum.

We will also be welcoming a home-school group to our museum in May.

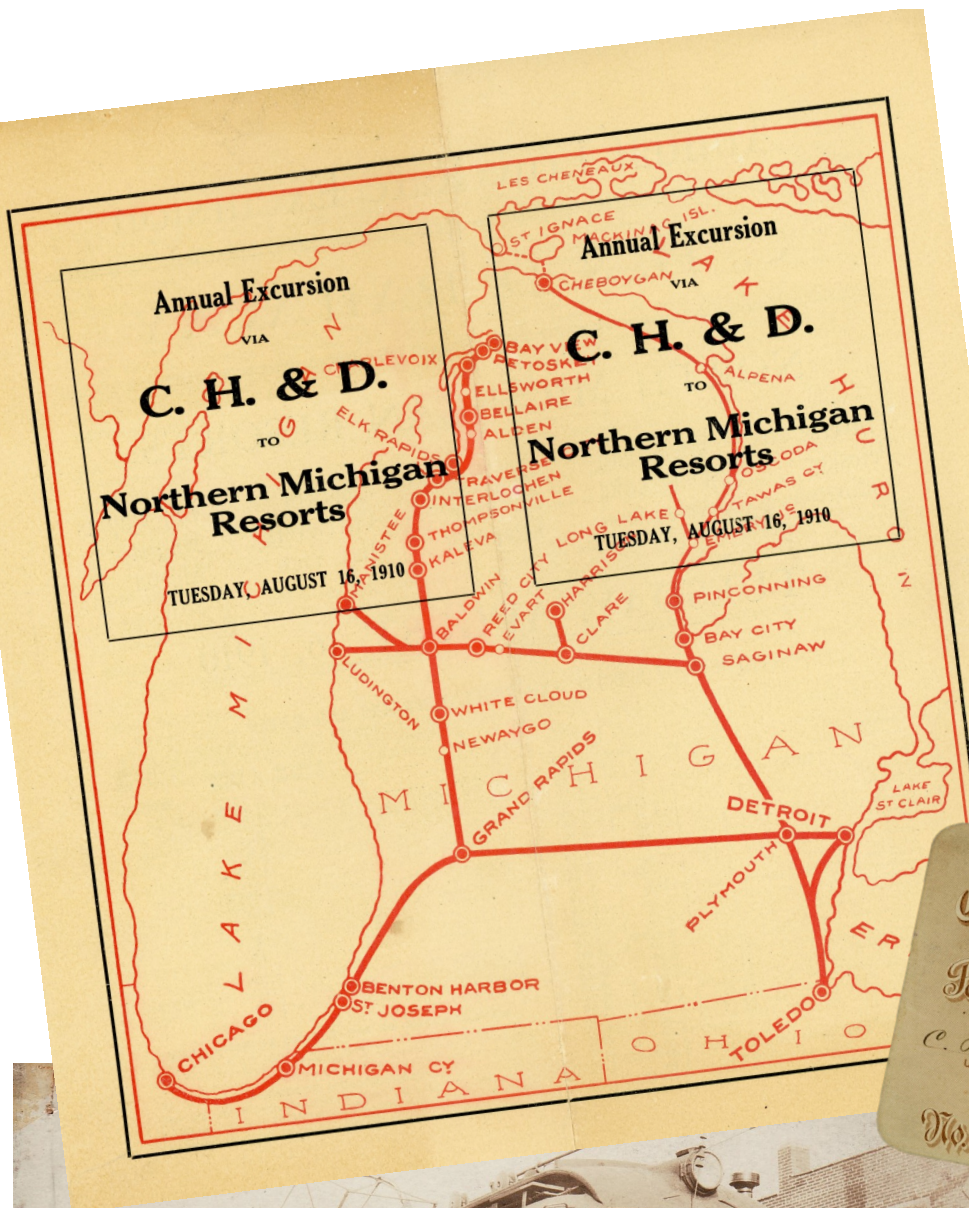


# DON'T YOU WISH WE STILL HAD THIS?

Did you know that between 1897 and 1939 Mt. Healthy had an electric streetcar, and that for years it was part of a regional streetcar system?

Included among our artifacts relating to the streetcar we have a 1910 flyer for an annual excursion on the Cincinnati, Hamilton, and Dayton line to northern Michigan.

Riders could take the trolley to various Michigan resorts, including Long Lake and Bay View, for just \$8.00. Those who wished to visit Mackinac Island could catch a boat at Cheboygan for just an additional dollar.

The Free Meeting House/Museum will soon be getting updated electrical wiring, which will make the building safer for the storage of our artifact collection.

Congratulations to Historical Society president, Penny Huber, who has been named Mt. Healthy's 2016 Alumnus of the Year!

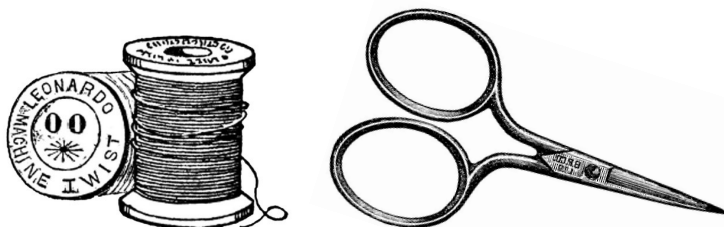
The Alumni Association chooses one outstanding alumnus to honor each year. Penny will be given this award at the High School during the Jr./Sr. High School Awards Night, May 10.
