SAFEGUARDING OUR ARTIFACTS

This past fall we applied for and received a grant from the W.E. Smith Family Charitable Trust, which is located in Butler County. With the \$1,000 they gave us, we purchased archival storage materials to better protect our artifacts. We're beginning by moving some of our clothing into large acid-free boxes.

Storing antique clothing in normal cardboard, or in contact with plastic or metal, is not recommended. The acid from normal paper and cardboard will damage fabric over time, plastic can trap damaging moisture, and metal, such as pins, will eventually rust.

Archival storage boxes are quite expensive, so we have never been able to obtain any, but now we have thirteen boxes and a roll of acid-free tissue paper, which will help ensure that our clothing remains well-preserved.

We have an impressive collection of apparel, dating from about 1870. Most of it has been stored away in boxes and plastic bags for decades. The dress pictured above, which dates from the 1870s or 1880s, is one of the pieces being moved. It has ruffles down the front and ruffles and fringe along the hem, and would have been worn with a bustle.

At the beginning of June we started cleaning out the storeroom at the museum, and now we're trying to organize things and put them back in so we know exactly what we have and where to find it. It's a huge job, but long overdue, and it's fun finding things we never knew we had (we'll share some of our finds in future newsletters). Thanks to the grant, we now have the correct storage materials for much of our collection.



DISCOVER HISTORIC MT. HEALTHY

The Historical Society will be participating in Ohio Open Doors, a "new statewide celebration" put on by the Ohio History Connection this coming September. On September 10, simultaneous with the Celebrate Mt. Healthy festival, visitors can get a guided tour of the Young Funeral Home and the Free Meeting House, and take a self-guided walking or driving tour around the historic "village" of Mt. Healthy. The tour will include exterior viewing of some of our oldest houses, such as the Hunt house on St. Clair, a historic home on Adams Rd., and others. It will also include information about our past tailor shops, and visitors will be able to see some of the former tailor shops that are still standing. The Ohio History Connection will promote our tour along with dozens of others on their website and calendar. It's an opportunity to put Mt. Healthy on the map!

Our Educational Program

Last year we launched an educational program in conjunction with the third-grade classes at South Elementary School, visiting each class with a presentation on 19th-century Mt. Healthy businesses. This year, we visited the classes twice—once to talk about businesses and once to talk about transportation and communications. We took along our old candlestick phone, which the students really enjoyed. Then, in May, the classes walked from South to the museum for a visit. They had great walking weather and the field trips were definitely a hit.

We had an additional guest during one of the field trips, as well, when Dr. Reva Cosby, the Mt. Healthy City Schools superintendent, stopped by to see the museum and the kids.

We want to try to expand the program next year to include the third-graders from North Elementary, if we can work out transportation.

The kids have been an enthusiastic audience, and are especially excited when they recognize an older building that they know today, such as Aquatics and Exotics.

This has been a great opportunity to teach our students about Mt. Healthy's past and to make more community members aware of our museum. The kids, teachers, and other adult chaperones all had a good time.

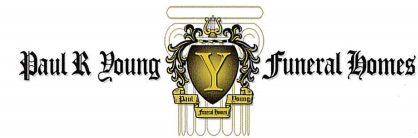
