

The museum will open at 12:30 and the tours will begin at 1p.m.

The historical Mt. Healthy residents who will be presented include:

John Lane (1793-1880) blacksmith, abolitionist

Charles Cheney (1803-1874) – postmaster, pioneer in mulberries for the silk industry, abolitionist, gentleman farmer, on the board of most early local institutions

Gilbert Lowe LaBoiteaux (1820-1914) Pony express rider, poet, entrepreneur

Jediah Hill (1826-1863) farmer, mill owner, bridge builder

Rebecca Graham Duncanson (ca.1825 – ca.1850) wife of the painter Robert, daughter of Reuben P. Graham

Marshall P.H. Jones (1828-1891) and [wife] Sarah Gibson Jones (1843-1938) he served in Cincinnati Black Brigade and gave the oration at close of service; educators, community service leaders

Caroline Lavinia Scott Harrison (1832 –1894) First Lady to Benjamin Harrison

Benjamin DeBaptiste (1842-1919) one of five local men who volunteered for the all-black 54th Massachusetts Infantry, and member of the renowned DeBaptiste family

Elizabeth Nourse (1859 –1938) artist

William "Dummy" Hoy (1862 -1961) major league baseball player [or Carson Hoy]

Garment Sewers honoring Mt. Healthy's historical tailoring industry
