

Mt. Healthy Brickyard

Frank Roettele founded the Mt. Healthy Brick Company in 1887 at what is now the south end of Forest Ave, near Arlington Memorial Gardens. This undated map shows the Roettele property on the west edge of the town:



As anyone who has ever tried to do any digging in Mt. Healthy knows, we have plenty of clay underfoot. It was the perfect place to produce the bricks for the homes and businesses being built in the growing community. The bricks are distinctive, having been stamped with "Mt. Healthy" when molded, with the style of the stamp changing over time. However, this feature is hidden in the walls they formed. The bricks must be removed in order to see the identification.

Frank Roettele's sons eventually took over the company. The brickyard remained in operation until 1942.



Brickyard Lake

Before the brickyard stopped making bricks, in March 1938, the lake on the property became a paid fishing spot. It also eventually had a tavern.

In March of 1941 the *Enquirer* reported that workmen enlarging the lake had unearthed a giant mastodon tusk, but didn't say what became of it.

Young Man Is Accused Of Kidnaping Attempt; Under Bond Of \$5,000

Those of you longing for the quiet old Mt. Healthy of the past may surprised to learn that things got a bit wild here at times.

In January 1941 a young man was arrested for attempting to kidnap a three-yearold girl at the lake. The girl, Delree Ferdon, was waiting for her father, who was picking up a delivery at the lake's tavern. The would-be kidnapper hid the girl under his overcoat when he left the establishment, but the father missed her and chased the man, catching him at the corner of Stevens and Forest Avenues and holding him until police arrived. The man told the police that he "liked children and merely wanted to take the girl for a walk." The father dropped the charges against the man, who was a medically discharged soldier whose father told authorities that his son was mentally ill.

In 1945 a lake employee was robbed and his car stolen near the lake and in 1946 the tavern was burglarized, with the thieves taking \$360. Another car theft was reported in April 1947 when a man from Walnut Hills was accused of stealing the car of his fishing companion, and another car was stolen from the property in September of the same year.

In 1951 the Brickyard tavern was charged with having illegal gambling devices.

The tavern burned down in December 1967, the suspected cause faulty wiring.

Many long-time Mt. Healthy residents have fond memories of spending time at the lake in the warm weather or ice skating there in winter.

When the state was preparing to finish Cross-County (Ronald Reagan) Highway in the 1990s, part of the old brickyard property was set aside to make up a portion of the wetland park at the end of Forest Ave. The little nature preserve is a far cry from the bustling brick-making business, fishing lake, and tavern that once stood on the spot.
