
Dave will be sorely missed.

What can we learn from a single photo?



Here's another photo that was recently featured on our Facebook page. Several readers correctly identified it as being on Compton Road, just west of Harrison Ave., looking west. (For those who have been around here a while, the homes pictured are right across from the location of the old Hoop Elementary.) One reader commented on the presence of the very nice sidewalk running alongside the dirt road.

Let's take a dive into some history. In May 1894, just one year after Mt. Healthy incorporated as a village, the Village Council voted on the issue of putting up street lights. Initially the tie vote was broken by the mayor, who voted down the measure. In November the Council was presented with a petition that again stated the need for the lights: "The importance and necessity of this matter is obvious to all and we feel it is a reproach to a town of the size and ability to pay for such improvements as ours that we are obliged to walk in darkness." Less than a year later a contract for lights was approved. In 1895 the village took another step toward modernization by putting in sidewalks, some of wood plank and some, as seems to be the case in the above photo, of concrete.
